## This Is A Good Place To Say Something About Finishes - Quoted from Sam Maloof

Before finishing but after shaping, a piece if filled (if necessary) and sanded. The filling compound is made of epoxy and fine sawdust. The sequence of sandpapers is, 100 grit, 150 grit, 280 grit, and 400 wet-and-dry used dry. Then the piece is burnished with 0000 (four aught) grade steel wool.

There are many very fine commercial wood-finishing products on the market today. I do not use any of them.

After experimenting with various finishes and mixtures, I finally arrived at the double-barreled finish I use today. This is made of urethane varnish, raw Tung oil, boiled linseed oil, and pure beeswax.

Some mixture of the last three ingredients has been used for centuries. It gives a warmer, more pleasing feeling than any other finish I know. The first mixture is composed of equal parts of urethane varnish (semi gloss), raw tung oil, and boiled linseed oil. There is enough drier in the boiled linseed oil to activate the raw tung oil. This is applied to the raw, sanded wood three times at one-day intervals. (Urethane varnish helps in the prevention of water spotting.)

The second mixture is equal parts of raw tung oil and boiled linseed oil to which I add shredded beeswax. Because I add the beeswax by feel, much as a cook seasons a sauce, the reader who wants to try my method will have to experiment. The final result is a mixture with the consistency of heavy cream. The oil mixture is heated to melt the beeswax. The safest way of doing this is in a double boiler on an electric hot plate. Always do this outdoors in a clear, safe area. Avoid using an open flame. Linseed oil has a very low flash point. BE VERY CAREFUL! Heat the oil just until the beeswax melts. The oil and wax homogenize readily. I store this mixture in a gallon can and apply it cold. It is not necessary to reheat it. It has a very long shelf life; I do not know exactly how long because I am constantly making and using it. Stir it before using.

One of the most important aspects of finishes, I believe, it that they invite me to touch, to caress, and to take pleasure in the wood surface. Furniture is to be used. The Please Be Seated" title that the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston used for its exhibition of my furniture state this well. Similarly a good finish should act like a


sign that says, "Please be seated."
